Conway School Board Report Monday, February 13, 2022

Student/Staff Accomplishments:

Health Science Technology (Kathleen Maynard): We recently added the Running Start Medical Terminology course and that the course has been going well with our class of 9 students. We had our site visit from a WMCC Professor Ann Morin 3 weeks ago. I would also be happy to share that we are moving forward with reinstatement of the LNA program, which was approved by the NH Board of Nursing. I am also happy to share that I've continued to work on developing our HST curriculum to be as holistic as possible. We continue to study Medical Math on Mondays, delve into medical ethics in all levels of HST, and learn about wellness practices that promote physical, mental and emotional health on Wednesdays (I teach a short yoga practice to my Level 1 and Level 2 classes at the start of class on Wednesdays each week). Students continue to show curiosity, motivation, and a strong ability to collaborate in my classes.

Construction Trades (Paul Cail): Upon finishing a shed the students applied a centuries old technique to the exterior called Shou Sugi Ban. Originating in 18th century Japan, Shou Sugi Ban is a particularly striking method of preserving wood by charring it with fire. Traditionally, this practice is used with Japanese cedar in order to weatherproof it. The wood is burned until the surface is charred, and then coated with natural oil. The shed is beautiful and will preserved forever.
